## From the Pastor

In Jules Verne's novel *The Mysterious Island*, he tells of five men who escape a Civil War prison camp by hijacking a hot-air balloon. As they rise into the air, they realize the wind is carrying them over the ocean. Watching their homeland disappear on the horizon, they wonder how much longer the balloon can stay aloft.

As the hours pass and the surface of the ocean draws closer, the men decide they must cast overboard some of the weight, for they had no way to heat the air in the balloon. Shoes, overcoats, and weapons are reluctantly jettisoned, and the uncomfortable aviators feel their balloon rise. But just temporarily. Soon they find themselves dangerously close to the waves again so they toss their food. Better to be high and hungry than drown on a full belly.

Unfortunately, this too, is only a temporary solution and the craft again threatens to lower the men into the sea. One man has an idea: they can tie the ropes that hold the passenger car and sit on those ropes. Then they can cut away the basket beneath them. As they sever the very thing they had been standing on, it drops into the ocean and the balloon rises.

Not a minute too soon, they spot land. Eager to stand on terra firma again, the five jump into the water and swim to the island. They live, spared because they were able to discern the difference between what really was needed and what was not. The "necessities" they once thought they couldn't live without were the very weights that almost cost them their lives.

Jesus uses a beautiful image in today's gospel, "Unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat; but, if it dies, it produces much fruit."

As he spoke those words, he knew well what was about to occur in the coming week. As he accepted the

Cross and gave himself away so that we could be forgiven, he proved that God's love for sinners was unlimited.

Doing nothing or being satisfied with things as they are is not the way to success for a follower of Christ. During these times of Lent we have given more attention to making time to pray, to embracing the Cross through our penances, and to being more generous with those who, in their need, call for our help.

We often measure out what we are going to give away. We plan to set aside twenty minutes for prayer every day – yet we could have a richer relationship with God by making the effort to have a conversation with the Lord all through the day. We are saying "No" to our self as we give up a favorite food or activity because it is Lent. But, we plant seeds of God's love as we say "Yes" to an opportunity to help someone in need or practice patience as we let someone else be in control of a situation. There are so many ways to share our riches with others, because these gifts given by the Lord carry a great responsibility. But good intentions are not the same as actually making the donation.

We will soon complete the season of Lent. But during this fifth week, our call is to accept the challenge of today's gospel. There are many people and things in our life that distract us from what is important. It is possible we need to pitch some overboard, cut the strings that hold us to things that are not worthy of a child of God. It can be a difficult and frightening exercise. But, we have the example of Jesus. His love was so powerful he gave away everything for our sake. And his gift opened the door to eternal life. "Unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat . . ." Jesus invites us to follow him.

## De El Pastor

En la novella de Jule Verne, La Isla Misteriosa cuenta de cinco hombres que escaparon del campamento de la prisión de la Guerra Civil robando un globo de aire. Al elevarse, se dieron cuenta que el viento los llevaba sobre el océano y mirando desde el horizonte desaparecer su tierra. Pensaron que tanto se mantendría el globo en el aire.

Al pasar las horas y al acercarse a la superficie del océano, los hombres decidieron echar afuera algo de peso, porque no había manera de mantener el calor en el globo. Sin querer tiraron zapatos, chaquetas y armamento y la incomodidad de los aviadores sintieron que el globo subió. Pero solo fue temporal, pronto se encontraron cerca de las olas entonces decidieron tirar su comida. Mejor estar en lo alto y con hambre que ahogarse con un estómago lleno.

Desafortunadamente, esto también solo fue una solución temporal, nuevamente fueron amenazados y se bajaron cerca del mar. Un hombre tuvo una idea: Unieron los lazos que mantienen a la caja de los pasajeros y se sentaron en los lazos. Ahora podrían cortar la canasta que estaba debajo de ellos. Al despojarse de la única cosa que les sostenía, cayó al océano y el globo subió.

No tan tarde, divisaron tierra. Deseosos de estar en tierra firme, los cinco brincaron al agua y nadaron hacia la isla. Sobrevivieron, porque pudieron discernir la diferencia entre lo que realmente era necesario y lo que no. Las “necesidades” que alguna vez creyeron que no podrían vivir sin ellas, eran el peso que casi les costaba la vida.

En el Evangelio de hoy Jesús usa una bella imagen, “Si el grano de trigo sembrado en la tierra, no muere, queda infecundo; pero si muere, produciría mucho fruto.” Al decir estas palabras sabía claramente lo que sucedería en las próximas semanas. Al aceptar la Cruz y darse así mismo para

perdonarnos, comprueba que el amor de Dios por los pecadores es ilimitado.

El hacer nada o estar satisfecho de cómo son las cosas no es la manera de triunfar para seguir a Cristo. Durante estos tiempos de Cuaresma hemos prestado más atención en hacer tiempo para orar, para abrazar la Cruz a través de nuestras penitencias, y de ser más generosos con los que, en su necesidad piden nuestra ayuda.

A menudo medimos lo que vamos a regalar. Planeamos destinar veinte minutos para la oración de todos los días – pero podríamos tener una relación más rica con Dios haciendo el esfuerzo de tener una conversación con el Señor durante todo el día. Estamos diciendo “No” a nosotros mismos cuando renunciamos a un alimento o actividad favorita porque es Cuaresma. Pero, Plantamos las semillas del amor de Dios al decir “si” a una oportunidad de ayudar a alguien en necesidad o practicando la paciencia y permitiendo que otra persona este en control de la situación. Hay tantas maneras de compartir nuestras riquezas con los demás, porque estos dones dados por el Señor cargan una gran responsabilidad. Pero las buenas intenciones no son las mismas que en realidad haciendo la donación.

Pronto concluiremos con el tiempo de Cuaresma. Sin embargo, durante esta quinta semana, nuestro llamado es aceptar el reto del Evangelio de hoy. Hay muchas personas y cosas en nuestra vida que nos distraen de lo que es importante. Es posible que necesitamos lanzarlas al agua, cortar las cadenas que nos sujetan alas cosas que no son dignas de un hijo de Dios. Puede ser un ejercicio difícil y aterrador. Pero tenemos el ejemplo de Jesús. Su amor era tan poderoso que dio todo por nuestro bien. Y su regalo abrio la puerta a la vida eterna. “A menos que el grano de trigo caiga al suelo y muera, sigue siendo solo un grano de trigo....” Jesus nos invita a seguirle.
