From the Pastor

Today is the fifteenth anniversary of the most devastating terrorist attack on the United States. For many, the images of the towers collapsing in New York and the Pentagon building with a huge gaping hole in its side and the crash site of Flight 93 in Pennsylvania have not been forgotten. We remember where we were, and the uncertainty of the days that followed, and the sense that this tragedy drew us together as a nation in a manner we don't often experience.

After fifteen years, there are now many young people who only know this as a historical event. And the patriotism and sense of national unity that spread through the nation in those months after the attacks often seem to be a distant memory amid the rhetoric of this political season. But, the horror of that day and the heroism and courage shown by so many continues to offer us inspiration and hope.

It was just an ordinary day for the small group of people there on the subway car. They would soon arrive at the Transportation Center and go off to their work in the World Trade Center or one of the other nearby office buildings. Then suddenly, just two stops before their destination, the car stopped abruptly and they were plunged into darkness as the electricity was cut off. Soon people began to panic as they could smell smoke coming through the tunnel. They were far below street level, and no one was sure how to get to safety.

But then, amid the panic and confusion, they heard a calm voice. He told them he knew the way out, and in the darkness, one-by-one, he took their hand and led them through the darkness up the stairs to the street level. And then he returned to help the next person,

and the next, until all were out of danger.

They had seen him sitting there every day on their commute into the city. They didn't know his story and never paid him much attention. No one ever spoke with him. But, after that terrible morning, they had a new appreciation for this man who had put aside his own safety to assure that each of them was rescued from danger. They now called that blind man and his guide dog the Angel of the Subway.

There were countless stories of heroism and tragedy on that terrible day. Firefighters and police officers and medical personnel streamed into the buildings as others ran for their lives. And many were lost. Over three thousand persons left their home, left their loved ones, headed out on a normal workday never to return. And we all were reminded that the world is a dangerous and uncertain place, and every day is a precious gift that we need to appreciate.

As we remember that fateful day, perhaps it is time again to refocus on what is most important. Finishing that project at work or watching another show on TV is not as important as making time to enjoy the company of those we love. Holding a grudge and giving the silent treatment is going to be such a waste of time as we realize the moment to speak our love is now lost. We can be an "angel" to another without putting our self in any danger at all simply by choosing to do something, to give our attention, to focus on someone else. We only have to do it. And today is the day.

De El Pastor

Hoy es el quinceavo aniversario del ataque terrorista más devastador de los Estados Unidos. Para muchos la imagen de las torres cayéndose, el Pentágono con un hoyo enorme a lado, el vuelo 93 en Pensilvania no se les ha borrado de la mente. Recordamos donde estábamos y la incertidumbre en los próximos días, que esta tragedia nos unió como nación de una forma que no experimentamos tan seguido.

Después de quince años, hay muchos jóvenes que solo saben de esto como un evento histórico. El patriotismo y el sentido de unidad nacional que se propago a través de la nación meses después de los ataques, a menudo parecen ser solo un recuerdo lejano en medio de la retórica de nuestra temporada política. Pero, el horror de ese día, el heroísmo y valor demostrado por tantos sigue ofreciéndonos inspiración y esperanza.

Era un día ordinario para un grupo pequeño de personas en el metro. Pronto arribarían al Centro de Transportación e irán a trabajar al Centro Mundial de Comercio o algún edificio cercano. De repente, a dos paradas antes de su destino se paró el carro abruptamente y todo se oscureció por que se cortó la electricidad. Las personas se aterrorizaron cuando comenzaron a oler humo que venia del túnel. Estaban debajo de la superficie y nadie sabía cómo llegar a un lugar seguro.

Pero, entre el pánico y la confusión escucharon una suave voz. Les dijo que él conocía la salida y en la oscuridad uno a uno tomó su mano y los sacó de la oscuridad hacia unas escaleras que les llevaban a la calle. Así regreso para auxiliar a una persona y a otra

hasta que todos estaban fuera de peligro.

Lo habían visto todos los días en camino a la ciudad. No sabían su historia y nunca le pusieron atención. Nunca nadie hablo con el. Despues de esa horrible mañana, tuvieron una nueva apreciación por este hombre, quien puso a lado su propia seguridad para asegurarse que cada uno de ellos fuera rescatado del peligro. Hoy le llaman a ese hombre ciego y a su perro guía, el Ángel del Metro.

Hubo innumerables historias heroicas y de tragedias de ese terrible día. Bomberos, policías, personal médico corriendo hacia los edificios mientras otros corrían para salvar sus vidas. Muchos murieron. Más de tres mil personas dejaron sus hogares, sus seres queridos al salir a un dia normal de trabajo y nunca regresaron. A todos se nos recordó que el mundo es peligrosos e incierto, cada dia es un hermoso regalo que debemos apreciar.

Al recordar ese día fatídico, probablemente es tiempo de reenfocarnos en lo que es importante. Terminar ese proyecto en el trabajo, mirar otro programa de televisión no es tan importante como disfrutar la compañía de aquellos que amamos. Guardar rencor e implementar la ley del silencio es un desperdicio de tiempo al darnos cuenta que el tiempo de hablar con nuestros seres queridos se ha perdido. Podemos ser un “ángel” para alguien sin ponernos en peligro, simplemente optando por hacer algo, ya sea dar de nuestra atención y enfocarnos en alguien más. Simplemente tenemos que hacerlo y hoy es ese día.
