

From the Pastor

There was an old man who lived too long and had become cynical about life. One day he was walking down the beach when he noticed a little boy in front of him. As he got closer, he discovered what the boy was doing. The boy was picking up starfish off the beach and throwing them back into the ocean. The man walked up to the child and said, "What are you doing?" The boy smiled and said, "I am saving starfish." "But," said the old man, "the beach goes on for miles and miles and there are thousands of starfish. What difference does it make?" The little boy reached down, picked up another starfish, tossed it into the ocean, and simply said, "Well, it just made a difference to that one."

In today's gospel, Jesus says, "You are the light of the world." As we think about it, we rarely find our self in the dark. We can flip a switch and light fills a room. We start the engine of our car and the lights come on if they are needed. Even in a momentary darkness, all we have to do is pull out our phone and the light of the screen will cast a dim light around us.

But, there is still much darkness in the world. Someone gives in to their anger and speaks terrible words that hurt another, and those words cannot be called back and the pain lives in the darkness of the memory of that moment. Someone sits there in a crowd, but no one knows them, or they don't seem to fit in, and as they are ignored and left isolated, it is as if they were not visible because they blend into the dark background. Someone is suffering, or obviously upset, and

since we do not know the words to say to make everything better, we say nothing and leave them in the darkness of their solitude.

Jesus does not make overcoming the darkness a group activity. He is clear. "YOU are the light of the world." Each of us is personally responsible for shining the light of his love into the darkness around us. When a child is demanding our full attention and we are too busy, we light the way to their experiencing how much they are loved as we stop and act as if the whole world revolves around them for a moment. It does not take much effort to say "Hello" to someone we do not know and welcome them to church or a meeting, and we may be lighting the way to a new friendship. We may have a neighbor who is all alone or a friend who just lost a loved one, and we can turn an everyday meal into a celebration of their importance as we invite them to come share the light of our family's love for one another.

There is darkness in the world, and we don't have the power to change everything for the better. But, we can do something that makes a difference. Every unexpected act of kindness, a smile given to a stranger, a word of encouragement or comfort does not have the power to overcome all the troubles around us. But, it makes a difference to the one who receives our simple gift. We make it possible for the light of God's love to shine into their life more brightly.



De El Pastor

Un hombre que había vivido por muchos años se hizo cínico sobre la vida. Un día al caminar por la orilla de la playa miro a un niño frente a él. Al acercarse, miro lo que estaba haciendo el niño. El niño estaba recogiendo estrellas de mar y las devolvía al océano. El hombre se aproximó al niño y le dijo, “¿Qué estás haciendo?” el niño sonrió y dijo, “Estoy salvando estrellas del mar.” “pero,” dijo el viejo, “la playa consta de muchas millas y hay miles de estrellas de mar. ¿Cuál es la diferencia que hace?” El niño se agacho, recogió otra estrella y la aventó al océano y dijo simplemente, “Bueno, hizo una diferencia a esta.”

En el Evangelio de hoy, Jesús dijo, “Tu eres la luz del mundo.” Si lo pensamos, raramente nos encontramos en la oscuridad. Podemos prender la luz en un cuarto. Encendemos el motor de nuestro carro y las luces se encienden si son necesarias. Inclusive en un momento de oscuridad, todo lo que tenemos que hacer es sacar nuestro teléfono y la luz de la pantalla nos iluminara.

Más aun, siempre hay mucha oscuridad en el mundo. Si nos dejamos llevar por el enojo y decimos palabras horribles que lastiman a otros, no podemos regresar las palabras y el dolor vive en la oscuridad del recuerdo de ese momento. Alguien está entre la multitud pero nadie lo conoce o no parecen encajar, y al ser ignorado y dejado solo, es como si fueran invisibles porque se pierden en la oscuridad. Alguien está sufriendo o enojado y como no sabemos que decir para hacerles sentir mejor, no

decimos nada y los dejamos en la oscuridad de su soledad.

Jesús no hace que el superar la oscuridad sea una actividad en grupo. Es claro, “TU eres la luz del mundo.” Cada uno de nosotros somos responsables de radiar la luz de Su amor en la oscuridad que nos rodea. Cuando un niño pide nuestra atención y estamos ocupados, iluminamos su experiencia por un momento al mostrarles lo amados que son al parar y actuar como si el mundo girara a su entorno. No toma mucho esfuerzo decir “Hola” alguien que no conocemos y darles la bienvenida a la iglesia o a una reunión, podemos estar iluminando la luz a una nueva amistad. Podemos tener algún vecino que está solo, o un amigo que acaba de perder un ser querido y podemos cambiar una comida ordinaria en una celebración para darles importancia con tan solo invitarles a compartir la luz de amor.

Hay oscuridad en el mundo y no tenemos el poder para cambiar todo. Pero podemos hacer algo que haga una diferencia. Cada acto inesperado de bondad, una sonrisa brindada a un extraño, una palabra de aliento, o consuelo no tienen el poder de sobre llevar los problemas que les rodean. Pero hace la diferencia en aquellos que reciben nuestro regalo sencillo. Hace posible que la luz del amor de Dios brille más en su vida.
