From the Pastor

Bishop Desmond Tutu was leading worship in the St. George cathedral in South Africa during the days of apartheid when his sermon was interrupted. South African security police filed into the church with weapons, tape recorders, and cameras. Their mission was to intimidate Bishop Tutu so he would not speak out boldly against the apartheid government.

Bishop Tutu stared them down. He said to them, "You are powerful. Very powerful. But I serve a God who will not be mocked." Then with a dazzling warm smile he said to them, "Since you have already lost, I invite you today to join the winning side." Immediately, the cowering congregation was transformed. They began to dance. They danced their way into the streets where even more security forces waited to intimidate them. The security forces ended up standing aside and letting the people dance. (Jim Wallis, editor of *Sojourners* magazine)

Jesus had big plans. He had come to offer salvation to everyone, in all places, in all ages, without any distinction. He wanted each person to know how much God loved them and that they had a part to play in God's plan for the world that no one else could accomplish. Jesus began in a small way, traveling mostly through the tiny villages of his native Galilee, and only going to the big city of Jerusalem on a few occasions.

Even after Jesus rose from the dead, the most common emotion ascribed to his followers was fear. They were not able to step outside their ordinary routine. They simply waited until Jesus suddenly appeared in their midst again. They were an essential part of the next phase of the plan to go out to all the world with the message. But something needed to happen.

And then, like a bolt of lightning, the Holy Spirit was poured forth by Jesus. And the effect was startling. Even an hour before, Peter, a simple fisherman, would not have imagined that he would be able to stand before a huge crowd of people and speak so eloquently that thousands would be moved to change their life. Yet it happened. And the crowd of people who came to see what all the

commotion was about did not start their day looking for a religious conversion. But, it happened. The Holy Spirit worked a miracle of speaking in Peter, and a miracle of hearing as people from all the known world could understand his words in their own language. The sound of rushing wind and the tongues of flame were soon shown to be only the beginning of the transforming work of the Holy Spirit in our world.

We should never forget the same Holy Spirit is at work today. When we are with a group of friends who are sharing the latest gossip about another, we fear speaking out to say something good about the person, or perhaps say nothing at all. But the Holy Spirit is offering us the courage to do what is right. We don't insist on a time of prayer to be included in our family routine, because we don't want to hear complaints. But, the Holy Spirit gives us courage to trust that a miracle of speaking will occur as we invite our loved ones to join us in inviting God into our home.

We do not begin the day expecting to be a messenger of the Kingdom of God. But, we hear about someone whose life has been struck by tragedy, and we are being given the opportunity to reach out to be a source of comfort and support. We meet a stranger, and we are being given the opportunity to remember that the Lord loves them as his sister or brother and so we treat them with respect, like a friend. When our plans are not working as we expected and we are frustrated, the Spirit offers us the strength to embrace our struggles as the will of our loving Father, and suddenly we cannot complain or feel sorry for our self.

Jesus continues to have big plans because the work of spreading his message of love and service is not finished. And the Holy Spirit always helps us to say exactly the right things, and to hear the invitations of God to love and serve him every day in new ways. And when we allow the Spirit to lead us, the effects will be dramatic, for the Kingdom of God will break into our world in ways we never expected.

El Obispo Desmond Tutu dirigía una adoración en la Catedral de San Jorge en el sur de África durante los días de segregación, cuando su sermón fue interrumpido. Oficiales de seguridad del sur de África entraron a la iglesia con armas, grabadoras y cámaras. Su misión era intimidar al Obispo Tutu para que no contradijera al gobierno.

El Obispo Tutu les miro hacia abajo y les dijo, "Ustedes son poderosos, muy poderosos. Pero yo le sirvo a Dios de quien no se burla." Despues con una sonrisa deslumbrante les dijo, "como ya perdieron, hoy les invito a unirse al lado ganador." Inmediatamente la congregación temerosa se transformó. Comenzaron a bailar. Bailaron por las calles donde inclusive les esperaban más fuerzas de seguridad para intimidarlos. La seguridad termino haciendo a lado y dejo que la gente bailara. Jesus tenia grandes planes. Había venido a salvar a todos, en todas partes, de todas las edades sin distinción alguna. Quería que todos supieran todo lo que Dios les ama y formaran parte del plan de Dios para el mundo que nadie más pudiera lograr. Jesús comenzó con cosas pequeñas, pasando por pueblos pequeños de su nativa Galilea y solo visitando la ciudad de Jerusalén solo por ciertas ocasiones. Aun cuando Jesús resucito, la emoción más común de sus seguidores era temor. No podían salir de su rutina ordinaria. Simplemente esperaron a que Jesús apareciera entre ellos otra vez. Eran parte esencial de la siguiente fase del plan de salir al mundo con el mensaje. Pero algo debía de suceder.

Como un relámpago, El Espíritu Santo les fue dado por Jesús. El efecto fue sorprendente. Una hora antes, Pedro, un simple pescador de hombres, se hubiera imaginado que se pararía frente a una gran multitud tan elocuentemente que les ayudaría a cambiar su vida. Pero así sucedió. La multitud que vino a ver la conmoción no comenzaron su día buscando una

conversión religiosa. Pero así sucedió. El Espíritu Santo hace Milagros al hablar en Pedro, el milagro del entender para que personas de alrededor del mundo entendieran su idioma. Las ráfagas de viento y las llamas de fuego, fue el principio del trabajo transformador del Espíritu Santo.

Nunca debemos olvidar que el mismo Espíritu Santo también trabaja así hoy día. Cuando estamos entre amigos compartiendo el último chisme de alguien, nos da miedo hablar algo bueno sobre la persona, probablemente no decimos nada. Sin embargo el Espíritu Santo nos fortalece para hacer el bien. No insistimos en incluir un tiempo de oración en nuestra rutina familiar, porque no queremos escuchar quejas. El Espíritu Santo nos fortalece para confiar que ocurrirá un milagro cuando invitamos a nuestros seres queridos a unirse para invitar a que Dios sea parte de nuestro hogar.

No comenzamos el día esperando ser mensajeros del Reino de Dios. Escuchamos de alguien que ha tenido una tragedia, y se nos da la oportunidad de ser un apoyo. Conocemos a un extraño, y se nos da la oportunidad de reconocer que el Señor les ama como hermanas y hermanos, entonces los tratamos con respecto como a un amigo. Cuando nuestros planes no van como esperamos nos frustramos, pero el Espíritu Santo nos fortalece para abrazar las dificultades como la voluntad de nuestro Padre y de repente no podemos renegar o sentirmos mal con nosotros mismos.

Jesús continúa teniendo grandes planes porque el trabajo de difundir Su mensaje de amor y servicio no ha terminado. El Espíritu Santo nos ayuda a decir exactamente las cosas correctas, escuchar la invitación de Dios para amar y servirle cada día en formas nuevas. Cuando dejamos que nos guie el Espíritu, los efectos serán dramáticos porque el Reino de Dios entrara en nuestro mundo de maneras que nunca esperábamos.
