# From the Pastor

An old man was traveling through the town in which he had lived as a boy. He recalled the many pleasant experiences he had enjoyed there. He thought especially of Tom, his boyhood chum. Tom had died, but his son was still living in the old house. Slowly the man made his way to the house, knocked on the door, and waited.

The door was opened by a middle-aged man. The old man introduced himself and said he had been a special friend of the younger man's father. Then he said, "I just wanted to see if I could see any of your father in you."

Today we celebrate Father's Day. And it is natural for us to express our affection for our father with a gift, or if he is no longer with us, to remember the life lessons we learned from him. Every time I look into the mirror, as I grow older, I am surprised to see someone looking back at me who looks so much like the father I remember and love.

But, today, as we honor our fathers, I am especially aware of how important it is to continue to reflect the example of my father's life and his devotion and care for my mother and their children.

My father was a great believer that each of his children should be a responsible person -- accepting praise for a job well done, and the consequences that arise from choosing to not act as we should. We never doubted that he was devoted to caring for us. Every morning he got up early, and left for a long, hard day at work as a carpenter in Fort Worth. He commuted sixty miles round trip! And when he came home, he made time to listen to the little kids who mobbed him, and give sports advice to the baseball stars, and spend time with our mother as they figured out how to deal with the latest needs of our big family.

My father was sure that the miracles needed to care for our family were

always on their way. There was never a question that we would be at Mass on Sunday, or that we would say grace before meals and then include an Our Father, Hail Mary and Glory Be so that the little ones would learn their prayers. And if our parish had any event, or needed volunteers, we were the first ones to arrive. We prayed a decade of the rosary every night as a family, and ended with a prayer for vocations. We rarely heard my father speak about God or his role in our life. Faith was simply reflected in the way we lived our daily life and the values instilled in how we treated one another in our home.

As the father of fourteen, imagine the tests of patience my father had to endure. He didn't have one cranky baby, he might have two or three upset at the same time. He didn't have to debate with one know-it-all teenager, because often several of us would gang up on him at the same time. He had to make sure there was food on the table, that perhaps 10 new pairs of shoes at a time were purchased for the new school year, that a trip to the emergency room could be covered. I still remember my father walking hand-in-hand with my mother years after their fourteenth child was born, and dozing in his easy chair with the newest grandbaby asleep on his chest, or being there watching my baby brother's baseball games after a long day at work day after day. He did not talk much about unconditional love, he just put it into practice.

Our prayer today is that God will continue to surround every father with his love and reward them for their sacrifices and loving care for their family. And as we remember our father on his day, we have to remember the most important way to honor him. We have to make sure that when others look at us, they see something of our father in us.

## De El Pastor

Un anciano estaba viajando por la ciudad en que vivía de chico. Recordó las muchas experiencias agradables que allí había disfrutado. Pensó sobre todo en Tom, su amigo de niñez. Tom había muerto, pero su hijo aún vivía en la casa vieja. Lentamente el hombre se encamino a la casa, tocó la puerta y esperó.

La puerta fue abierta por un hombre de edad media. El anciano se presentó y dijo que había sido un amigo del padre del joven. Luego dijo: "Yo sólo quería ver si había algún semblante de tu padre en ti."

Hoy que celebramos el día del padre. Es natural expresarle nuestro cariño con un regalo, o si ya no está con nosotros, recordar las lecciones de vida que aprendimos de él. Cada vez que me miro en el espejo me sorprende ver que alguien me mira y es tan parecido como el padre que recuerdo y amo. Hoy, al honrar a nuestros padres, soy consciente de lo importante que es continuar reflejando el ejemplo de vida de mi padre, de su devoción y cuidados para mi madre y sus hijos.

Mi padre siempre creyó que cada uno de sus hijos debía ser una persona responsable, aceptando halagos por un buen trabajo bien hecho, y las consecuencias que surgieran de los actos que no debían haber escogido. Nunca dudamos que fue devoto en su cuidado a nosotros. Todas las mañanas se levantaba temprano, se iba por una larga y dura jornada de trabajo como carpintero en Fort Worth. Hacía sesenta millas diarias. Cuando llegaba a casa daba el tiempo a escuchar a sus pequeños que le acosaban, daba consejos a los jugadores estrellas de baseball, pasaba tiempo con mi madre para manejar las necesidades que surgían en nuestra familia grande.

Mi padre estaba seguro que los milagros necesarios para cuidar de nuestra familia siempre estaban en camino. No había duda si iríamos a Misa el domingo, o daríamos gracias antes de comer y luego incluir un Padre Nuestro, Avemaría y Gloria para que los más pequeños aprendieran sus oraciones. Si nuestra parroquia tenía cualquier evento, o necesitaba voluntarios, éramos

los primeros en llegar. Todas las noches rezábamos una década del Rosario en familia y terminábamos con una oración por las vocaciones. Raramente escuchamos a mi padre hablar de Dios o su papel en nuestra vida. La fe simplemente se reflejaba en la manera que vivíamos nuestra vida diaria y en los valores inculcados en cómo tratarnos unos a otros en el hogar.

Como padre de catorce hijos, imaginen las pruebas de paciencia que mi padre tuvo que soportar. No tenía solo un bebé irritable, podría ser dos o tres teniendo un mal rato al mismo tiempo. No tenía que discutir con un adolescente 'sabelotodo', porque muchas veces algunos de nosotros conspirábamos contra él al mismo tiempo. Tenía que asegurarse de que había comida en la mesa, tal vez comparar 10 nuevos pares de zapatos al mismo tiempo para el nuevo año escolar, tener suficiente para cubrir un viaje a la sala de emergencias. Todavía recuerdo a mi padre caminando de la mano de mi madre años después del nacimiento de su decimocuarto hijo, dormitando en su sillón con su nuevo nieto dormido en su pecho y viendo los juegos de béisbol de mi hermano chico, después de un largo día de trabajo día tras día. Él no hablaba mucho sobre el amor incondicional, sólo lo ponía en práctica.
