During his lifetime, “Little Al” played numerous events in the area for local politicians, foreign dignitaries, actors, thugs, mugs and even future Presidents. A small man in stature, yet a giant of a man among the local professional musicians. His fondest memories were always of the working people he seemed to gravitate to at his gigs. The staff, the waiters, bus-boys and cooks were his kind of people. I can imagine he even talked a few of them out of a fresh cup of coffee and a desert. He was a quiet man and always put others before himself. As he would say if he were here with us now “Yea Man” I made the “Downbeat” for my last “Gig” and “I will not be late.”
