# From the Pastor

here is a story told about a church in Knoxville, Tennessee. It was one of those center-city churches that time seemed to have passed. Its membership had long since largely moved to the suburbs. Those who still

drove downtown to the church were mostly aging. The church received a new pastor and not long after this pastor's arrival, the pastor organized a program of feeding the homeless and the hungry in the church. Not all of the long-time, established members appreciated this change in their cozy little fortress in the center of downtown. After worship one day, one of the people in the congregation accosted the pastor and asked, "Why, in God's name, do we need all of these deadbeats coming around for a hand-out? Many of us are no longer comfortable coming here for worship. It makes no sense that we are offering a service to the homeless that the Rescue Mission already performs so well. Can you give me one good reason why you are doing this?" The pastor thought for a moment and then softly replied, "Well, I guess it is because I am trying to love people as Christ has loved me and by doing so, I am able to point people to God." The questioner was somewhat taken aback and said, almost apologetically, "Oh, please don't misunderstand. I know those people need God." And the pastor looked at her and said, "I hope you don't misunderstand me. I am not talking about those people. I am talking about you."

It is our belief that the words Jesus spoke were meant to inspire us just as they did the crowd who first heard the Sermon on the Mount, for he continues to speak to us. It is our belief that as he embraced the terrible death of the cross he was considering us as an individual, and knowing our sins he offered himself in our place so that everything would be forgiven and we can begin again. It is our belief that as he returned to life from the dead he was already preparing for us personally to do the same.

But, what is interesting about this personal relationship with Jesus is that it is never the Lord's intention that we focus only on him and what we receive and how we show our gratitude to him. He is always challenging us to admit that our relationship with him involves his brothers and sisters. Every person we meet, whether we know them well or not at all, is a unique opportunity to love Christ, honor his presence, forget our self and serve him. We are expected to serve Christ in others.

You are the salt of the earth. We are to make things around us more "tasty" because we are there. That might involve being positive in our attitude and willing to pitch in and help, even when what needs to be done isn't our idea or something we would do. It could be putting on a smile and keeping our troubles to our self instead of complaining and going around with a sour face. Speaking a word of encouragement or simply expressing our appreciation for how important someone is for us gives a new meaning to their daily routine.

You are the light of the world. Things can hide in the dark, but everything becomes clear in bright light. We hide our imperfections, we keep our prejudices to our self, we bite our tongue instead of saying something hurtful. But, more is expected. We are to live in such a way that it is clear that Jesus is inspiring us. When we are asked to help at an inconvenient time, we are invited to shine forth our love for Jesus with the attitude of forgetting our self to serve another. When our feelings are hurt, we are invited to shine forth a Christ-like attitude of forgiveness, which forgives and then moves on as if all has returned to normal, because we reflect the love of Christ.

Each of us is called to point other people to God. But, we always have to be careful that before we begin directing someone else's life, we have made sure that we are living in such a way that we clearly understand our importance in the world. It is Jesus who inspires us, lives with us, invites us to give all to him. And, when we make him most important, everything else falls into its proper place.







Después de un día de culto, una de las personas de la congregación abordo al pastor y le dijo, "en el nombre de Dios, porque necesitamos a todos estos holgazanes que vengan por comida? Muchos de nosotros ya no nos sentimos cómodos de venir aquí al culto. No tiene sentido que estemos ofreciendo un servicio a los desamparados que la Misión Rescate ha realizado tan bien. ¿Me puede dar una buena razón por que estamos haciendo esto? El pastor pensó por un momento y suavemente le respondió, "Bueno, creo que es porque estoy tratando de amar a las personas como Cristo me ha amado y al hacerlo estoy llevando a las personas a Dios." El que le pregunto estaba desconcertado y dijo en una manera casi disculpándose, "O por favor no me malinterprete. Sé que esas personas necesitan a Dios." Y el pastor la miro y le dijo, "Espero que usted no me malinterprete. No estoy hablando de esas personas. Estoy hablando de usted."

Creemos que las palabras que Jesús hablo eran para inspirarnos al igual que lo hizo a la multitud que lo escucharon primero en el Sermón de la Montaña, porque El continua hablándonos. Creemos que cuando tomo la terrible muerte en la cruz estaba considerando a cada uno de nosotros individualmente, y conociendo nuestros pecados se ofreció asimismo en nuestro lugar para que todo se nos perdonara y pudiéramos comenzar de nuevo. Creemos que cuando regreso a la vida de la muerte. Él ya había preparado lo mismo para nosotros.

Lo que es interesante sobre esta relación personal con Jesús es que el Señor nunca ha tenido la intención que nos enfoquemos solamente en El y en todo lo que recibimos y como le mostramos nuestro agradecimiento. Él siempre nos reta a admitir que nuestra relación con El incluye a nuestros hermanos y hermanas. Cada persona que conocemos, aunque no lo conozcamos bien es una oportunidad única para amar a Cristo, honrar Su presencia. olvidarnos de nosotros mismos y le sirvamos. Se espera que sirvamos a Cristo en los hermanos.

Ustedes son la sal de la tierra. Debemos hacer las cosas que nos rodean mas "sabrosas" porque estamos ahí. Esto puede incluir tener una actitud positiva y dispuestos ayudar aunque no se nuestra idea o algo que haríamos. Puede ser poner una sonrisa y dejar nuestros problemas para nosotros mismos en vez de renegar y andar con caras amargadas. Dar una palabra de aliento o simplemente expresar nuestro aprecio por lo importante que es alguien para nosotros cambia el sentido de su rutina diaria.

Tu eres la luz del mundo. Las cosas se pueden ocultar en la oscuridad pero todo saldrá a la luz del día. Escondemos nuestras imperfecciones, mantenemos nuestros prejuicios, nos mordemos la lengua en vez de decir algo hiriente. Pero se espera más de nosotros, debemos vivir de tal manera que sea claro que Jesús es el que nos inspira. Cuando se nos pide que avudemos en un tiempo inconveniente, se nos invita a que dejemos brillar nuestro amor a Cristo con una actitud de perdón, el cual nos lleva a ver que todo vuelve a la normalidad porque reflejamos el amor a Cristo.

Cada uno de nosotros estamos llamados a llevar a otros a Dios. Pero debemos tener cuidado que antes que comencemos a dirigir las vidas de otros, nos aseguremos que estamos viviendo de tal manera que claramente entendamos nuestra importancia aquí en el mundo. Es Jesús el que nos inspira, vive con nosotros, nos invita a que le demos todo y cuando lo hacemos el más importante en nuestra vida todo está en su lugar.
